Who are we?

GAAF is a broad coalition of students, societies, and staff members working together to get the University of Glasgow to cut their ties with arms and fossil fuel companies.

What are our demands?

The University currently invests £5.5 million in fossil fuel companies and £6.8 million in arms companies. We have

3 principle demands:

- Divest from all arms and fossil fuel companies
- Ethical careers
 policy, banning oil,
 gas, coal, mining and
 arms companies from
 recruiting through the
 University
- Accessible climate crisis course for staff and students

These investments contradict the ideals that the University claims to embody. We do not stand for a University which does not stand for us.

Why should we divest?

We do not see arms and fossil fuel companies as legitimate companies with which to do business.

- The arms trade funded by the University actively displaces people in war torn areas such as Palestine and Yemen.
- The University committed to fossil fuel divestment in 2014. However, they still maintain a close relationship with oil and gas companies by actively promoting careers in an industry that is destroying our chance of a liveable future.

What is divestment?

Divestment is simply the opposite of investment. It means getting rid of certain stocks, bonds or investment funds.
